Universal Design for Learning --- 5/20 Tip (Prybutok)

- Use frequent small quizzes rather than large exams
 - Goal: increase frequency of student assessment and lower anxiety surrounding testing
 - Justification: Not all students are equally confident/able to perform on tests despite understanding of material; frequent low-stakes quizzes gives them the chance to show mastery with less stress and gives instructors more frequent opportunities to assess student learning and make changes as needed.
 - Method: Use 4-5 quizzes (generally non-cumulative) each worth 10-13% of student grades instead of 2-3 exams worth 20+%
