US Program Update (Nance)

Summary:

- ChemE is going to pilot a minimum requirement, students can declare a major after meeting certain minimum required classes:
 - Completion of DTC Placement Requirements (CHEM 142, 152, MATH 124, 125, 126, PHYS 121, ENGL Composition)
 - Completion of ChemE Major Declaration Survey
 - Completion of ChemE Orientation & Advising
- Non-DTC students can declare and benefit from ChemE advising and increased sense of belonging & decreased stress
- Clear communication to campus community regarding availability of ChemE major as an option for pre-major students
- Compared to conditionally placed ENGRUD students, these students will be more prepared, stronger students.
- Nicole Minkoff clarified that Non-DTC students are also interest-changers, not necessarily transfer students
- Could potential to acquire up to 16 additional students this year based on the initial assessment.
- Cole asked if there is a cap on the number of students that can enter via this method. Elizabeth said not at this time but that may be a good problem to have for ChemE.
- Dan asks what happens, if they can switch majors from ChemE to another. Nicole says anyone can change majors, this is a more accessible pathway for students who want to be ChemE but they aren't in COE and aren't sure if they would get in.

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ABET Discussion (Adler)

Summary:

- Performance indicators showed some low numbers, indicates that students are struggling with their prerequisites
- Use an embedded assessment, questions that are embedded into exams or assignments.Don't just use exam scores or quiz scores as criteria
- There have been some changes at ABET. Stu will share and discuss later

Additional comments:Space policy update to include information about vacating space (Ben Rutz)

• Formalized language about what happens when people leave designated spaces has been added to the space policy document (on MyChemE)
